House of European History

Is your school group visiting the House of European History in Brussels?

[Book the workshop – “EU Pioneers - The Creation of Today's Europe”](#) at the House of European History permanent exhibition – and help your students understand the milestones of European integration and their relevance today.

At the end of this 90 minute workshop, students will leave with a deeper understanding of the European Union's history and values, the people who built it, as well as a clearer picture of what the EU represents for them on a personal level.

The [new temporary exhibition “Presence of the Past. A European Album”](#) will be open from 28 March 2025 to January 2026. This documentary photography exhibition reveals how Europeans engage with the past in their everyday lives today. [Book a guided visit](#) for your students aged 16 years old and over: the guided tour is based on public participation using the “Visible Thinking Method”, encouraging observation of the photographs before going into a facilitated discussion. HistoriCall - New digital resources for civic and history education.

Ahead of Europe Day on 9th May, the House of European History has launched new digital resources named HistoriCall. Created by the museum educators, together with a multidisciplinary team, it was tested with over 100 teachers and 2000 students, to ensure the materials are age-appropriate and engaging for secondary school students.

HistoriCall proposes to explore the early days of European integration through the personal lens of its founders and through a simple set of questions to develop critical thinking skills. This approach not only conveys historical knowledge, but also helps understanding about why it is still relevant today for each learner. It is available online, for free, in the 24 languages of the EU.
